1. Workshop at: Churu, Rajasthan

What is happening in Churu?



RangSutra is currently working with a group of 250 women in Churu, Rajasthan on a 'surface embellishment technique', namely, Tie and Dye. The women hail from the local communities and have been known to the craft through generations.

Up next, 30 women will be participating in the Sampling Workshop to be organised by RangSutra in the month of June.

Craft at Churu : Tie and Dye

Tie and dye is the art of tying small knots on fine fabric by pinching it with the help of a thimble. The design is resisted by knotting and then dyed in various colours.

2. Workshop at: Bhadla

What is happening in Bhadla?



RangSutra is currently working with Rajasthan Renewable Energy Corporation Ltd. And Asian Bank of Development on community wellbeing by generating livelihood opportunities for the local community through promotion of the local handicrafts of Bhadla, Bap tehsil, in Rajasthan.

Currently 150 women have been made a part of the RangSutra family and have participated in the Skill Assessment and Upgradation training workshop.

Up next, the final Skill Assessment and Upgradation workshop will be organised with the women and the 1st Craft Manager's training workshop will be conducted with 25 women selected from the local community with leadership skills. The women in the region will be the first-generation earners on account of their gender and will play the stewardship role of encouraging gender equality and equity within their community. *The workshops will be held in the month of June 2017.*

Ralli means to 'connect'. The women of this community made Ralli bed furnishings- quilts

and bed covers made by stitching together pieces of cloth- as dowry to their daughters.

RangSutra has been successful in breaking the taboo of using craft for dowry as craft for income. The women now make Ralli for sale in the glocal and local markets and dream of becoming entrepreneurs in the future.
